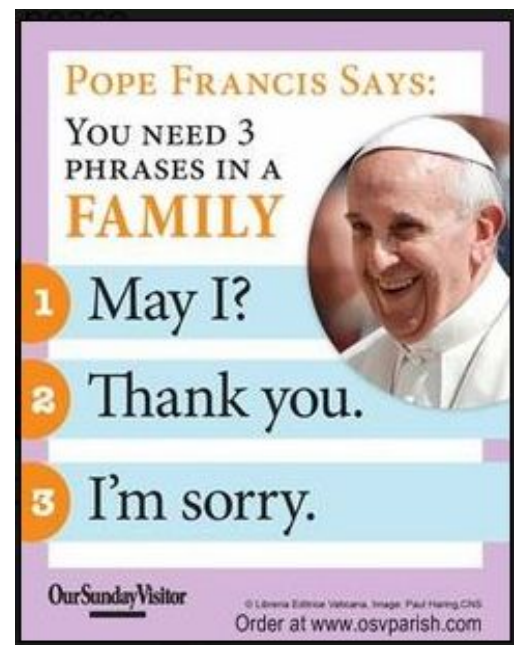

Donation Scheme 2020

The St Joseph's Board of Trustees have decided to opt-in to the donations scheme.

After careful consideration, including parent responses to the survey, the Board decided to take the \$150 donation per student based on July 2019 roll. Things considered included whether we would still be able to offer all of the opportunities that parent contributions have allowed in the past. Costings showed that with careful budgeting we would still be able to offer most things including skiing and swimming. The Board however will be reliant on parent contributions to assist with funding school camps. The majority of parents in the survey stated that they would support this. If, for some reason, camp donations were not made by parents, a review of what we can afford to offer would be undertaken.

Therefore, in 2020 we will be asking parents to contribute to camp costs in Rooms 6 - 9. We will still be able to ask parents and guardians for payments related to optional activities outside the curriculum, including shows and after school sports. As in the previous years, parents can pay these in full or through a regular payment throughout the year.

This group works hard all year organising fundraising events and opportunities for meeting together as a community. This includes class dinners and the parent morning teas.

Recently they donated \$9,000 towards the purchase of junior reading material, lego for the junior rooms, sandpit toys, trestle tables for the hall, Room 6 furniture, and Kapa Haka uniform additions. Thank you for all the work that you do.

They are working especially hard at the moment to ensure a great night at our inaugural Night Market next Friday.

Safe Cycling

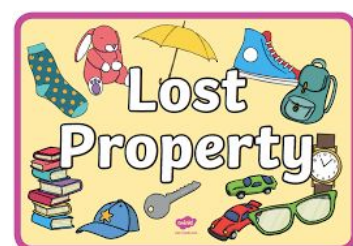

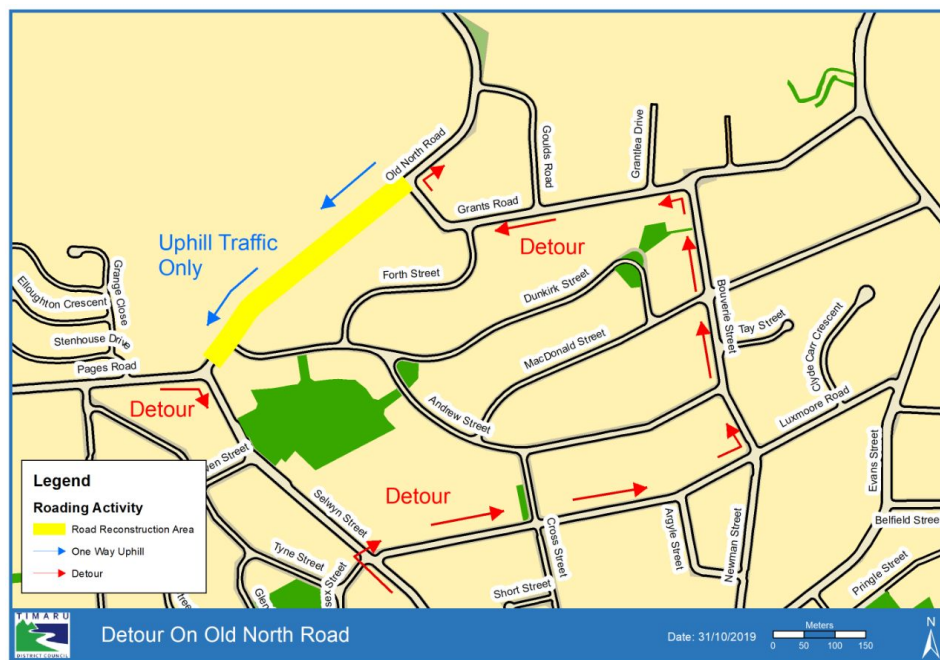
To reduce delays to traffic and ensure a quicker and safer construction period the TDC are asking road users to consider alternative routes.
